The Rector Writes

Humility Under Persecution

THE Church year is filled with many opportunities to remember the Christians of the past.

One of the more inspiring ones is a man known as Polycarp of Smyrna (c. 155 AD). We remember him on 23rd February.

He is remembered because he is an early Christian Martyr but left behind some very inspiring words, and because he was a disciple of the Apostle John.

At a very advanced age, Polycarp was condemned for being a Christian and sent to the Arena to be killed, if he didn't recant his faith.

His words have come down to us: "For eighty-six years I have been his [Jesus'] servant and he has never done me wrong; how can I blaspheme my King, who saved me?"

He is an example of humility under persecution, and a true Christ-like character throughout his life.

As a Bishop, he wrote many letters, dealing with false teachings (heresy), and many words of wisdom, including the following:

"Pray also for kings and powers and rulers, and for them that persecute and hate you, and for enemies of the cross, that your fruit may be manifest to all, that you may be perfect in him [Jesus]."

As we continue through the Diocesan Year of Prayer, these words should challenge and inspire us. May we too pray like that.



Hethersett Gardening Club

In the Members' third meeting since the first "Covid lockdown", Ted Hallett gave a well illustrated talk about the National Trust's Hatchlands. a garden in Surrey, a "landed gentry" type of property which he had known from his days of childhood. It is situated next to the village of East Clandon, near Guildford, which is now a "Conservation Area".

Hatchlands is one of several such estates to be found in the scenic southwest corner of Surrey heading toward Hampshire. Currently it houses a collection of pianos and is home to the National Gardening Scheme organisation. Its parterre garden is now under restoration.

Humphrey Repton the landscape gardener, worked at Hatchlands and his works included an orangery.

Young Ted's father gained employment as a gardener at Hatchlands around 1947. Ted and his siblings enjoyed the privilege of roaming the house's large estate, with its farm animals and fishing lake.

For the eight year duration of his father's employment. Ted's home was the rather internally basic gate house. The Hallett family had other duties, such as opening the gate to allow the then owner's motor car to drive through non stop. One enjoyment was the house owner's Xmas Party for his staff's children and another was the hosting of the annual gardening show for the village.

The club meets on the third Wednesday of each month except December, which is usually on the second Wednesday, at 7.30 pm in the Methodist Church Hall, Great Melton Road, Hethersett. All are very welcome - occasional visitors are charged £2, refreshments are included.

WORLD DAY OF PRAYER

(A WOMEN LED, GLOBAL, ECUMENICAL MOVEMENT)

"I KNOW THE PLANS I HAVE FOR YOU"



2022 is a special year for World Day of Prayer in England, Wales and Northern Ireland. This year, we have prepared the World Day of Prayer service.

It has been both challenging and rewarding to write about the three countries that make up our area: our landscape, people and culture all shaped by our history. We celebrate our diversity and the contribution made to our countries by the many groups and individuals who have made their home here. We use our Bible text "I know the plans I have for you" from Jeremiah to reflect on some of the issues facing us today: poverty, domestic abuse and disability, finding hope in difficult situations and encouragement in the help we can give to each other.

World Day of Prayer is an international ecumenical organisation which enables women all over the world to share the ideas and concerns of the writing country. Preparation for the day has taken several years. Our International Committee based in New York co-ordinates the work of National Committees and facilitates the creation of our annual World Day of Prayer service on the first Friday in March.

The service outline, created by the writing country, is distributed to the rest of the world, along with a Bible reflection, country background and children's and - for the first time - young people's activities.

All this work will come to fruition on **Friday 4th March** when services will take place beginning in Samoa and moving on through New Zealand and Australia, across Asia, Africa and Europe and finally the United States and South America before finishing in American Samoa.

Across England, Wales and Northern Ireland, services will take place in large urban centres, such as Central Hall Westminster, and in remote village churches. We will use modern technology to reach those unable to access a service but hope to be able to extend a welcome and hospitality once released from lockdown.

Village Litter Pick


THE Hethersett Environmental Action Team organises regular monthly litter picks in the village

There was another excellent turnout from Hethersett residents for the latest litter pick on January 15th.

Twenty four volunteers collected 17 bags of litter which was disposed of by Tesco's.

Pickers said that this proves that you never know what you might find on a litter pick and also illustrates the possible dangers that these lanterns can cause.

The next litter pick will be on Saturday 5th February starting at 2 pm from Hethersett Village Hall. Everyone is welcome and equipment is supplied.

Verge Parking Problem

Hethersett Parish Council has received complaints about parking on verges around Recreation Road at weekends.

A letter to the council from a resident was discussed at the latest council meeting. Council vice-chairman Stephen Slack referred to the parking situation as a "perennial problem." but one that had improved during the week now that Woodside School in Firs Road has closed.

Fellow councillor Mike Stark said that inconsiderate parking takes place throughout the village and throughout the country as a whole and is nothing new but posed obvious problems for residents trying to use pavements.

December seems long gone now, but perhaps many will remember the two days when Christmas Specials ran again at Vine Cottage.

Over the two days, 418 passengers travelled through Santa's Grotto, 192 of the smaller ones getting a present. Thanks are due to all the good folk who made it work so well. Many thanks to the Friends of Little Melton Church and friends of the Friends. Proceeds from ticket sales, shop, tombola, cake sales and refreshments produced an overall profit of £564.78, which divided equally, meant that cheques for £282.38 each, went to Friends of Little Melton Church and East Anglia Children's Hospices, Quidenham.

EDITOR'S Note—The LMLR was a seven and a quarter inch gauge miniature railway which ran at Vine Cottage once a month. It ran at the home of enthusiast Bob Brett and delighted people of all ages. The Future of Hethersett Post Office

ON page 20, we looked back on the past of Hethersett Post Office and news that 10 years ago Kevin Salmon took over as postmaster.

Kevin retired on January 13th of this year and, at the time of going to press, Hethersett is without a post office.

It is hoped that this will only be a temporary measure as a social media post by the chairman of Hethersett Parish Council Adrienne Quinlan pointed out:

"The Parish Council has been in correspondence with Post Office Counters Limited since November 2020 in an attempt to retain a Post Office within the village.

The Parish Council can confirm that one interested party remains in discussion with Post Office Counters Limited and we are working with Norfolk County Council and Post Office Counters to secure temporary accommodation in order for a Pop Up Post Office to operate in the village."

At January's meeting of Hethersett Parish Council, Mrs Quinlan added that she was hopeful that a post office would return to the village in the not too distant future.

She said that staff had been available to provide a temporary pop up post office but a suitable venue had not been found, although this is still a possibility for the future as discussions continue for a permanent replacement office.

In a letter to customers, the Post Office said: "We are writing to inform you that regrettably following the resignation of the postmaster and the withdrawal of the premises for Post Office use, the above branch will be closing temporarily on Thursday 13th January, 2022.

The letter goes on to say "We would like to assure you that we are currently investigating the options available which will enable us to reinstate a post office service to the local community."

We hope to have more news about the future of a post office in Hethersett in the March edition of Good News Magazine.

The Captain and His Son

A wander through the churchyard of St Remigius feels like a history lesson with so many stories of loved ones and people who have made an outstanding contribution to both Hethersett and Norfolk life. Here is the story of a father and son—one of whom revolutionised the parks of Norwich and the other who died in tragic circumstances.

MANY older Hethersett residents will remember a man they knew as The Captain.

Captain Arnold Edward Sandys-Winsch (1888–1964) was born in Knutsford, Cheshire. He attended Cheshire Horticultural College, becoming a landscape architect, and was articled to the renowned landscape architect, Thomas Mawson. During the 1914-1918 world war he was first with the Royal Field Artillery, then attached to the Air Service as a pilot and was finally with the British Army of Occupation.

In 1919, he became Parks Superintendent in Norwich, a post he held for 34 years. In the early 1920s it was proposed that he use men unemployed after demobilisation to help construct some of the Norwich parks, a job he clearly carried out with dedication and meticulous attention to detail.

At the time Norwich had very few open spaces but when he retired the city had about 600 acres of parks and open spaces. Sandys-Winsch also created model allotments and organised the planting of 20,000 trees in the parks and streets. In his time as Parks Superintendent, he changed radically the appearance of Norwich and

created green spaces on a huge scale. His work can today be seen in Norwich open spaces such as Eaton Park. He was also responsible for designing Norwich's Ring Road.



Arnold Sandys-Winsch (pictured above) was also a national authority on growing and judging daffodils and an active member of the Norfolk and Norwich Horticultural Society and Hethersett Horticultural Society. he lived for many years in Station Lane, Hethersett,

Arnold's son Simon E. Sandys-Winsch (1926–18 June 1954), was killed at the Highlander event on the Isle of Man TT (Time Trial) races in June, 1954. Simon was an English professional motorcycle racer, who became the 48th person to be killed on the Snaefell Mountain Course when he crashed on 18th June at the Highlander on the first lap of the senior event.

Arnold and Simon are buried together in St Remigius Churchyard.
