Forty Years Of Service

ONE of the biggest challenges facing the church in Hethersett is how to attract newcomers to the village through its doors.

So says The Rev Christopher Mallett who, as we reported in the July edition of Good News, has just completed 40 years as a priest.

For much of that time Christopher carried out his church work alongside his employment as a nurse. He soon found that the two "professions" dovetailed well, with his Christian beliefs helping with his work in hospitals.

Christopher started his Christian journey as, what he describes as, a "Cradle Christian" with his family always involved in church life at Tilney All Saints and Tilney Cum Islington in West Norfolk. Tilney Cum Islington now has a ruined church.

Christopher remembers vividly going to the Royal Norfolk Show in 1952 where he was drawn to a Christian tent and met the then Bishop of Norwich the Rt Rev Percy Herbert who asked him what he wanted to do on leaving school and suggested entering the church.

He took a slightly circuitous route to the church, however, beginning his working life as a banker and then becoming a nurse of some note, progressing through the ranks and working in Bury St Edmunds, Cambridge, Bristol and then Peterborough before being appointed

senior nursing officer at the Norfolk and Norwich Hospital in 1976. In those days The N and N also encompassed Dereham Hospital and the Colman Hospital in Norwich.

Wanting to live fairly close to his work, Christopher and his family which consisted of his wife Sheila and two daughters found a house in Bailey Close in Hethersett, a property he still owns.

As we mentioned last month, Christopher became the first person to be ordained in St Remigius' Church in Hethersett and somehow managed to fit in both his medical and church work which occasionally proved problematic when he was on hospital duty on Sundays. He was also a part time chaplain at Wayland Hospital from 1986 until 2000.

Christopher saw his role at Hethersett as supporting the existing clergy: "An emphasis in my training was put on supporting parish clergy and helping them with their work," he said.

When he came to the village, the Rev Michael Sexton was Rector, Rev Sexton is now in his nineties and Christopher is still in touch with him. Christopher has served under four different Rectors—the Rev Michael Sexton, the Rev Bryan Llewellyn, the Rev Di Lammas and the Rev Derek McClean. The new incumbent, still to be appointed, will give him a nap hand.

For Christopher one of the biggest challenges facing the church in general

and in Hethersett specifically is attracting new people. He has seen The Church change and modernise over the past 40 years and has also seen the physical boundaries shift. When he became a priest, Hethersett was bracketed with Ketteringham. It subsequently lost Ketteringham but gained Little and Great Melton.

"I am sad that, although the village has grown, the attendance at church and the membership hasn't kept pace. This to me is a big challenge," he said.

It is a challenge he hopes to continue to be a part of as he enters his fifth decade as a priest. One thing that has pleased him is the close relationship St Remigius now has with Hethersett Methodist Church, working together to promote Christian unity.



Connie The Carer

HETHERSETT has lost an animal champion with the death of Connie Tindale who was affectionately known as the Hedgehog Lady for the gift of life that she gave to hundreds of hogs at her home in Grove Road.

Connie died in June after a long illness which never prevented her from lavishing care on the small creatures which she nurtured and cared for before releasing them back into the wild.

Connie took in hundreds of hedgehogs at her home and, using special diets, heat pads and other equipment, nursed them back to health. For many, she was the go to person when hedgehogs were found injured or confused by modern life as an article in the Eastern Daily Press from a few years ago underlined with the heading

"They cannot cope with the modern world. Connie gives the gift of life to hedgehogs."

Connie had a rich and varied life that included setting up a charity for children in Egypt, a country where she lived for many years. She was also a published author on subjects as diverse as Bonsai trees and Egyptian History.

Beauty—In The Eye Of The Beholder

Love it or hate it? "Beauty is in the eye of the beholder".

Our churchyard can be seen as a haven of peaceful serenity where nature and passed loved ones can be admired and remembered. Or, it can be seen as untidy and unkempt. Governance of the churchyard is done through The Churchyard Regulations of 2016 which outline various responsibilities. The Parochial Church Council's responsibility is to maintain the churchyard to a reasonable standard to allow access to the graves.

The responsibility for the grave plots themselves lies with the owners of the plots. In addition to this there is a "green drive" across the Church of England which our current Bishop Graham is pushing for. Recent Rural Churches Forums have made it clear that areas with unkept/natural growth should be the norm not the exception. To this end, All Saints churchyard is managed for conservation in three areas; one in the newer churchyard extension, one by the church itself and

one by the path leading to the church. These areas do not cover any tended graves and indeed in the extension are not around any graves.

These areas were selected because they have a particular profusion of wild flowers and plants on which insects thrive. Our intention is to maintain these areas whilst keeping the rest of the churchyard accessible. With the help of a grant from the parish council, we have a contractor who mows the grass during the summer months. In addition, there is a working party every month that works its way around the churchyard strimming and tidying up as much as possible. With very few volunteers and with rapid growth during certain parts of the year it can be very difficult at times to keep on top of things.

We do our best and realise that we will never please everyone but if anyone would like to help, they would be most welcome.

Our next working party will be on Saturday, 5th August at 10 am.

Ceri Bids Farewell

HETHERSETT musician Ceri Peterson has bowed out after 10 years as leader of Wymondham Symphony Orchestra.

Ceri's last concert with them was in Wymondham Abbey in July when the orchestra performed a special work "Living Stones" written by its conductor Andrew Parnell, along with works by Brahms and Dvorak.

Ceri's life has been surrounded by music since she was born. She started

playing the piano at the age of four and the violin when she was just eight. Music became one of the dominant forces in her life, along with the love of her tightly knit family.

Ceri moved with her husband Gordon to Norfolk and Hethersett in 2000. She grew up in Beverley in the East Riding of Yorkshire and at school played a prominent role in the East Riding Youth Orchestra whilst also playing with the Hull Philharmonic and Beverley Chamber Orchestras.

She then studied music at Birmingham University and graduated with a BMus Honours degree with a diploma in violin performance. She led the university orchestra and, after gaining a PGCE from the University College of Ripon and York St John, began a teaching career in South Humberside and then the East Riding before moving to Norfolk where she became a peripatetic teacher with the Norfolk Music Service, teaching children of all ages.

From 2012 to 2015, she was string co-ordinator and tutor for the Norfolk County Youth Orchestra and from 2020 until 2022 was string tutor for Guildhall Young Artists in Norwich.

Ten years ago she joined Wymondham Symphony Orchestra (WSO) as its leader and says she has very fond memories of her time with them.

Ceri's final performance with the WSO was a celebration in more ways than one. It not only marked her 10 years as leader and her retirement from the orchestra, but also the 20th anniversary of Andrew Parnell's involvement. His work "Living Stones" was originally composed for the 900th anniversary of Wymondham Abbey in 2007.

Looking back on her 10 years with the WSO, Ceri picks out her performance as a soloist for Vaughan Williams' ever popular piece "The Lark Ascending," as one of her highlights in "a very happy 10 years."

Ceri admits that she will miss the orchestra, although she feels it is the right time to retire. "I will miss it. It is always exciting when a work comes together," she said. But Ceri is certainly not retiring from music. She has many projects on the go.

She currently plays at weddings with a group of friends known as "Cordes Strings." When lockdown restrictions were eased a little, this group delighted Hethersett residents by practising in the open air near Ceri's home.

She is also a member of a relatively new chamber orchestra entitled Ensemble East which is based in Norwich. She will continue her work in schools and also coaching a number of individual students in violin and viola at her home.

More About Rev James McAnally

In the previous edition of Good News I mentioned the connection between a church in Great Massingham in West Norfolk and St Remigius in Hethersett. This involved the McAnally family and here are some details of The Rev James McAnally that I subsequently came across.

The Rev James Mortimer La Fontaine McAnally spent over seven years serving Hethersett before the outbreak of the Second World War.

He wrote extensively in the Good News magazine about the war and the part it played in Hethersett. The Rev McAnally was married with a daughter Rachel Mary. Rachel married Donald Dashwood on 21st December 1940 and died on 8th May, 2001.

Rev McAnally had a very varied career.

He was born in 1888 which made him 44 when he moved to Hethersett and 51 at the outbreak of the Second World War. He was educated at Keeble College, Oxford, gaining a BA degree in 1909 and a Masters Degree in 1913. He was made a deacon in 1911 and a priest in 1912 and was curate at Wymondham from 1911 to 1913 before some of his writings in Good News working at Edgbaston in Birmingham

from 1913 to 1916 and Eton College from 1917 until 1921.

He was Rector of Newdigate in Surrey from 1921 until 1927 and Rector of Haslemere in Surrey from 1927 until 1932 when he moved to Hethersett where he stayed until 1942. He was also vicar of nearby Ketteringham from 1939 until 1942. He moved to Alton Barnes in Wiltshire where he stayed until 1945 when he became vicar of Netherbury with Solway Ash in Dorset. He served there until 1953 and was curate in charge of nearby Stoke Abbott from 1949 to 1951 and Rector from 1951 to 1953.

He was Rural Dean of Beaminster in Dorset from 1948 to 1953 before moving to St Edmundsbury and Ipswich from 1953 to 1956 and that saw him living in Southwold. He was Rector of Spexhall with Wissett in Suffolk from 1956 to 1958 before being awarded the living of Shotesham in 1959. He was curate in charge at Worstead and at Westwick with Slolev from 1962 to 1964. It is likely that he died in either 1976 or 1977.

In next month's Good News I will round off my articles about Rev McAnally with around the time of the Second World War


